Professional Field Experience: HP 4V79 Internship in Human Performance or HED 4V80 (Study Abroad). HED 4V80 may be used as a substitute for HP 4V79 or as a HHPR Restricted Elective. Students must have 60 hours earned and attend mandatory Internship meeting one year prior to field experience. Internships for academic credit must be approved by the program director and comply with University policy. First Aid and CPR certifications are required to enroll in this course. The internship may be 3-6 credit hours.

Transfer students must have a cumulative GPA corresponding to the minimum requirements for each track.

Students who wish to change their major to Health Science Studies after completing course work at Baylor may do so only at the end of a full semester. Current HSS students wishing to change their HSS concentration can do so only during the eligibility period (at the end of a full semester). Students must have a cumulative GPA corresponding to the minimum requirements for each track:

Pre Medical/Dental 3.2 cumulative GPA
Pre Physician Assistant 3.2 cumulative GPA
Pre Physical Therapy 3.2 cumulative GPA
Pre Athletic Training 3.0 cumulative GPA
Health Professions 3.0 cumulative GPA

Students whose cumulative GPA falls below the minimum requirement in any semester will be placed on probation for one semester. Students whose cumulative GPA falls below the required minimum for their track for a second consecutive semester must select another major or alternative track for which they do have the minimum cumulative GPA. Once a student is removed from a track requiring a minimum CGPA, they may not return to any of those tracks in the future, regardless of any CGPA increase. Students who wish to change their major to Health Science Studies after completing course work at Baylor may do so only at the end of a full semester. Furthermore, current Health Science Studies students who self-select to change their major during a semester in which their CGPA falls below the minimum requirement for their concentration at the end of the semester, will be considered dismissed from the Health Science Studies major and will not be permitted to return.

Students who do not successfully complete BIO 1305/1105 and BIO 1306/1106 with a C or better in 2 attempts will be dismissed from their track and must select another major or alternative track for which they do have the minimum cumulative GPA.
